IN	Names of towns, provinces, states or countries.	I live in Lac St-Jean.
ON	Name of steets	She lives on Brown street.
AT	House number and street, location	He lives at 23 victoria street.

PREPOSITIONS	WHEN TO USE	EXAMPLE
AT	Location in general	We are at home.
IN	Specific place inside.	We are in a kitchen.
TO	After verbs of motion: go, come, move, run, walk	They are moving to Ontario.

PREPOSITIONS	WHEN TO USE	EXAMPLE
IN	Months, years	My birthday is in January.
ON	Days, dates	We`ll be there on Monday.
AT	Time	The game starts at 7:30.

Subject Pronoun: I like the book.

Object Pronoun: Give the book to me.

Poss. Adjective: I want my book.

Poss. Pronoun: That book is mine.
